## Minutes of January 20, 2021 COBWRA Delegates Meeting Conducted Via Teleconference Call

**DRAFT MINUTES – UNOFFICIAL – NOT FOR PUBLICATION**  
*Minutes to be approved at next month's Meeting*

President Beth Rappaport called the meeting to order at 9:30 AM via Teleconference Call. Participants logged on by phone and accessed visuals by downloading a PDF presentation that was distributed via email.

### Introduction, Welcome, and Meeting Dedication

- President Beth Rappaport welcomed everyone and thanked them for participating.
- The meeting was dedicated to Mel Morris, a long-time COBWRA Board member and dear friend, who passed away recently.

### Announced Guests were introduced by Philip Levine

- Danna Ackerman-White, Senior Administrative Assistant; Mayor David Kerner; Lori Berman, State Senator, District 31; Karen Brill, Vice-Chair, School Board of PBC; Joe Capozzi, Administrative Assistant, Vice Mayor Robert Weinroth; Joseph Casello, State Representative, District 90; Jenny Ceasar, Outreach Coordinator, Congresswoman Lois Frankel; Michelle Damone, Administrative Assistant, District 5 Commissioner Maria Sachs; Evelyn Duplece, Legislative Assistant, Senator Lori Berman; Shawn Eastman, Captain, PBCSO District 6; Sophia Eccleston, Senior External Affairs Manager, Florida Power and Light; Dorothy Jacks, Property Appraiser, PBC; Dave Kerner, Mayor, PBC; David Martelo, Area Distribution Manager, FPL, South Palm Beach County; Stacy Mills, Director, Free Standing Emergency Services at JFK Medical Center; Mike Pratt, Director of Community Outreach, PBC Property Appraiser's Office; Rosemary Rayman, Director, Information Services, LWDD; Ed Sol, District Secretary, State Representative Emily Slosberg; Tony Tozzi, Battalion Chief, PBC Fire Rescue; Robert Weinroth, Vice-Mayor, PBC

### ELECTED OFFICIALS' REPORTS

- **Lori Berman, State Senator District 31**
  - The PBC Department of Health COVID-related email address – [chd50feedback@flhealth.gov](mailto:chd50feedback@flhealth.gov) has been shut down. All who previously emailed that address are being contacted to set up appointments.
  - The legislature is conducting committee meetings, filing bills, and facing a significant budget shortfall.
- **Dave Kerner, PBC Mayor**
  - 100,000 vaccines have been completed in the County.
  - Pharmacies at 67 Publix groceries in PBC will be administering 100-125 vaccines per day per pharmacy to people 65+ beginning January 21. At this time, all appointments have been taken, but more will be available soon.

- **Robert Weinroth, PBC Vice-Mayor**
  - To request a vaccine appointment at Publix, go to <https://www.publix.com/covid-vaccine/florida> . They are currently booked but will open the website several times per week to take reservations.
  - To date, over 700,000 seniors in Florida have received vaccinations. Florida is receiving 265,000 vaccinations per week.
- **Karen Brill, Vice Chair, PBC School Board**
  - Today the District is voting on a 3.5% salary increase for employees of its bargaining groups.
  - She will suggest an alternative to the District's proposed August 10, 2021 start date for students, that has teachers arriving during the first week of August.
  - Many classrooms will watch the presidential inauguration.
  - She invites everyone to the COBWRA Education Committee's Zoom meeting on Tuesday, February 23 at 7:00 PM. Issues specific to the COBWRA area will be discussed.
- **Dorothy Jacks, PBC Property Appraiser**
  - Reminded new eligible property owners to file for the Homestead Exemption. The filing deadline is March 1 for 2021. File 24/7 online at <https://www.pbcgov.org/papa> or call for more information.
  - Pink postcards were mailed acknowledging the renewal of existing Homestead exemptions.
  - Mike Pratt, Director of Community Outreach, PBC Property Appraiser's Office can supply information to communities about the Homestead Exemption.
- **Superintendent of Schools Update – Beth Rappaport for Donald E. Fennoy II, Ed.D**
  - The graduation rate for District-operated schools reached an all-time high of 94.4% for the Class of 2020, an increase compared to 2019's graduation rate of 91.6%.
  - The School District's graduation rate continues to outpace the state's average of 90%.
  - Twenty-two of the District's high schools have a graduation rate of 90% or higher.
  - Dr. Fennoy has sent a letter to the Governor, FDOE Commissioner, and Director of Emergency management urging the state to prioritize school-based staff for COVID-19 vaccinations.

## FIRST RESPONDERS' REPORTS

- **Captain Shawn Eastman, PBSO District 6**
  - The District 6 lobby remains closed due to COVID-19. If in need of reports, call the Central Records office.
  - COBWRA area communities contributed to gifts and meals provided during the holidays through the Sherriff Department's Community Policing.
  - Overall crime was down in 2020 and so far in 2021.
  - The "Pillowcase Burglar" was arrested after a year-long investigation involving hundreds of cases in PBC and across the state.
  - Deputies are concentrating on catching people speeding to encourage safe driving.
- **Tony Tozzi, Battalion Chief, PBC Fire Rescue**
  - There has been an increase in carbon monoxide calls. Carbon monoxide is a colorless, odorless gas produced by internal combustion engines, such as cars and generators, and fires. CO detectors should be installed in hallways near the garage, patio, and bedrooms.
  - Make sure to turn off car engines when in the garage. PBC Fire Rescue is distributing door hangers to remind people to turn off their cars.
  - Generators and any running motors must be at least 10 feet away from a house.
  - Call 911 if a CO alarm sounds and exit the residence immediately.

**PRESIDENT'S REPORT – BETH RAPPAPORT**

- Beth welcomed new COBWRA Board members Neil Ambrosio of Canyon Lakes as Treasurer, and Linda Wilson of Colonial Estates as Director.
- Incumbents retained their seats in the Lake Worth Drainage District election.
- COVID vaccines are available now, or will soon be, at CVS, Walgreens, local hospitals, the Health care District in John Prince park, South County Civic Center, and the South Florida Fairgrounds. COBWRA has provided information to the state to help get mobile units into our 55+ communities. If, and when they are available, member communities will be notified.
- The Water and Wetlands Committee will hold a Zoom symposium on “The Future of Water in South Florida” on January 26 at 7:00 PM.
- The Education Committee will hold a Zoom forum with the PBC School District on February 23.
- The Government Affairs Committee will participate virtually in PBC Days in Tallahassee.

- A quorum was confirmed.

**GROWTH MANAGEMENT REPORT – DAGMAR BRAHS**

- A presentation of the proposed Imaging and Dialysis Center on the site of a former PNC Bank building on Hypoluxo Road east of Jog Road was emailed to the delegates prior to today's meeting. In the proposal, sufficient parking spaces will be provided; a monument sign will be installed. Large oak trees and some palms will remain; other plantings will be replaced. The Growth Management Committee and the COBWRA Board recommended approval with a roof color change, agreed to by the developer.

**MOTION:** To recommend approval of the Imaging/Dialysis Center at Jog and Hypoluxo with the condition of a slate gray roof. The Motion was passed unanimously by the delegates, 47-0.

- For now, GL Homes has withdrawn its request to purchase LWDD easements.
- The Magistrate’s Hearing about the Ski lake project is scheduled for January 21. Beth Rappaport and Dagmar Brahs will attend as observers.
- A strip mall shopping center approved many years ago is under construction on SR7/441 at Melrose Park.
- COBWRA’s Call to Action yielded 2,200+ emails sent to the Village of Golf voicing opposition to the proposed Amazon Distribution Center.
- A gas station with 12 pumps is under construction on the southeast corner of Woolbright and Military. The current, smaller gas station on the northeast corner will move to this site.

**NOMINATING COMMITTEE – BETH RAPPAPORT**

- In response to the call for nominations, five delegates/alternates have been nominated for the five positions on the Committee and will serve on the 2021 Nominating Committee: Joan Brunswick, Royal Lakes; Debbie Murphy, Pine Tree Country Club Estates; Sharon Reuben, Valencia Isles; Myrna Rosoff, Aberdeen; Steve Wolfberg, Valencia Pointe.
- Sharon Reuben was appointed Temporary Chair until the Committee’s organizational meeting.
