

President Freedman called meeting to order @7:02 PM with quorum established.

Presidents Report:

- 2. Summer Projects: Joanne Slocum to overlook w/Harvey Brecher assisting; Electrical work @front entrance; flagpole area & clubhouse; all to be brought up to code; plus 3-4 solar lights. Pool will be closed 2-3 days for power wash, pavers to be sealed & area's re-sanded; notice will be posted as soon as date available; Tennis court has been cleaned; new pavers installed at mailbox area.

Motion made by H. Brecher to begin the process of implementing the proposed committee system as submitted by President Freedman, Vice-President Joanne Slocum & Marie Allen ASAP; 2nd by J. Rana. Motion passed 7-0 with email approval for J. Slocum & M. Allen.

NEW BUSINESS:

Applicant Program (Campbell Property Mment): this program replaces existing (traditional) approach to receiving & approving any applications for new residents to one using technology; all applications will be filled online; all records will be at a secure website; no cost to HOA; a \$100 fee will be collected from the applicant/applicants.

4. Adjuster (Roof) Insurance:

Per President Freedman & recommendation of Damian (HOA Insurance agent) he has been discussing an insurance claim per Five Star Claims adjuster; proposal no cost to HOA; his company receives 20% of what he can recover. They will do an engineering inspection of the roofs in community & many pictures; he will try to replace windows at clubhouse with hurricane impact windows; no results for at least 6 months; once we receive date of inspection it will be posted on all bulletin boards. Motion made by H. Brecher to retain Five Star Claims Adjusting; 2nd by J. Grimaldi. Motion passed.

COBWRA DELEGATES MEETING HIGHLIGHTS • BELLAGGIO • MAY 15, 2019

WELCOME

BELLAGGIO DELEGATE BARBARA ROTH and PRESIDENT PAM ROTHMAN welcomed the COBWRA guests to their community.

FIRST RESPONDERS' REPORTS

RICHARD CHRISTMAS from PALM BEACH COUNTY FIRE

RESCUE expressed appreciation for the new law that grants benefits to firefighters with cancer. The law recognizes cancer as an on-the-job injury for Florida firefighters. He also encouraged everyone to become CPR certified and reminded the Delegates that it's time to begin preparing for hurricane season.

SHERIFF RIC BRADSHAW explained that the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Department is the lead agency for Homeland Security. Sheriff Bradshaw also discussed his appearance before the Senate Judiciary Committee regarding mental health issues.

PBSO DISTRICT 6 CAPTAIN SHAWN EASTMAN announced that there have been multiple arrests and hundreds have been charged in the banking scam case. Because the illegal activities involve multiple states, the case is being taken over by the FBI. Captain Eastman also reported a decrease in all categories of crimes and that there have been 50% fewer burglaries in comparison to last year's statistics.

ELECTED OFFICIALS' REPORTS

COUNTY COMMISSIONER MARY LOU BERGER reminded the Delegates that her office is available as a resource and to assist with any issues that arise.

DISTRICT 3 SCHOOL BOARD MEMBER KAREN BRILL

announced a "small win" in the recent legislative session which will enable plans to move forward to build the middle school adjacent to Sunset Palms Elementary School.

SUPERVISOR OF ELECTIONS WENDY SARTORY announced that new equipment has been purchased and that a new voter registration system has also been implemented. She also announced that her department is currently hiring Poll Workers.

FUNDRAISING COMMITTEE REPORT

FUNDRAISING COMMITTEE CHAIR VICTORIA MORTON

reported that the committee's debut event, COBWRA CONNECTION: A Community Association Vendor Expo has raised \$26K.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

PRESIDENT BETH RAPPAPORT acknowledged the Health & Wellness Committee for their very successful symposium on STRESS and encouraged everyone to attend the Fundraising Committee's Vendor Expo.

GROWTH MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

GROWTH MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE CHAIR STEVE OSEROFF presented two projects to the Delegates for a vote:

- Public Storage facility on Military Trail, South of Hypoluxo Road to include a 3-story storage building to replace outside storage and enhancements to the site visible from Military Trail. The Growth Management committee and the COBWRA Board had previously voted to recommend approval of the project as presented. The Delegates voted to recommend approval as presented.
- Boynton Commons MUPD located on the NE Corner Boynton Beach Blvd. & the Florida Tumpike. The proposal calls for modifying an existing 2008 proposal from 115,000 sq. ft. Medical office to mixed use, dramatically lowering traffic (trips per day). The project will include three uses
 - Medical Office & Retail
 - Congregate Living Facility (CLF)
 - Self Storage

The Growth Management committee and the COBWRA Board had previously voted to recommend approval of the project as presented. The Delegates voted to recommend approval as presented.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE PRESENTED BY THE COBWRA-AREA LEGISLATIVE DELEGATION

Senators Lori Berman and Kevin Rader, joined by Representatives Emily Slosberg, Tina Polsky and Joseph Casello reported on the results of the 2019 Legislative Session. Among the session's successes were two bills supported by COBWRA: A bill cracking down on Sober Homes and a bill making driving while texting a primary offense. The Firefighters with Cancer Bill was touted as a big win. However, the members of the Delegation expressed concern that the 2019 Session represented an attack on public education and homerule.




